

GERMINATION OF SEEDS

WITH THE NAME OF ALLAH, MOST GRACIOUS, MOST MERCIFUL.

When a seed begins to grow to become a new plant, then it (the seed) has germinated.

The germination of seeds is also an example of how Allah (S.W.T.) repeats creation.

We read in Sura A-Akabut (C. 29): verse 19:-

“See they not how Allah originates creation, then repeats it: truly that is easy for Allah.”

Allah (S.W.T.) provides the seeds with water and sunlight which they need so that they may germinate.

Who else but Allah (S.W.T.) causes the seed to grow into a new plant!

In Sura Al-Waqi'a (Ch. 56): verses 63 - 65 we are reminded:-

“Do you see the seed that you sow in the ground? Is it you that cause it to grow, or are we the cause? Were it our will, we could crumble it to powder, and you would be left in wonderment...”
